HORNIK RECOUPS SNOW REMOVAL COSTS FOR MARLBORO TAXPAYERS

*Mayor Receives \$270,000 Federal Reimbursement for
December Emergency*

MARLBORO -- The Township has received \$270,000 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of New Jersey toward the cost of the December 26, 2010 State of Emergency.

“We’ve pursued every option the Town has to keep local costs down for the taxpayers,” Mayor Hornik said. “The July heat didn’t mean we forgot about the costs of winter.”

New Jersey declared a State of Emergency in response to the record December snow storm. The declaration triggers a process whereby the Township may be reimbursed for costs associated with the emergency response by FEMA.

In December, the Township was forced to approve a \$370,000 emergency addition to the 2010 budget in order to pay the costs of snow removal associated with the December snow event.

“Our residents count on the roadways being clear and safe. I am pleased the taxpayers of Marlboro are being reimbursed for some of the costs of this historic storm,” said Mayor Hornik.

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
