Dear Neighbors,

As most of you are aware, at the end of 2017, President Trump signed legislation to cap the local property tax exemption in the Federal Tax Code. This legislation imposes a significant financial burden on the residents of our community.

Additionally, this legislation is a form of double taxation on Marlboro residents, as we are now in a position of paying Federal income

taxes on the taxes we pay to State and local governments. Let us not forget that New Jerseyans already send more tax dollars to Washington D.C. than we get back.

In response, this week I sent a memo to the Township Council asking for their support for a resolution in support of Governor-Elect Murphy's proposed state legislation that would allow taxpayers to make charitable, tax deductible contribution to municipalities, counties and

school boards.

The resolution will come before Town Council for a vote at the meeting scheduled for January 18 at 7pm in Town Hall. As always, these meetings are open to the public and all are welcome to attend.
