Welcome to Marlboro Township. We are dedicated to providing the highest level of law enforcement services to our residents. Our Mission Statement directly relates to our commitment and quality of service that we offer Marlboro residents.

The Marlboro Police Department is an integral part of our community. In addition to attending all community events, we work collaboratively with the Marlboro schools. Student Resource Officers (SROs) act as liaisons with school officials, conducts school programs and attends faculty and parent meetings. We also work with school administration to ensure the safety and security of the students.

From time to time we utilize a reverse 9-1-1 system to impart important public safety updates. Cell phones, as well as certain land lines, are not automatically included in this program. During Hurricane Sandy, residents discovered that their phone was not a part of the reverse 9-1-1 or they couldn't receive calls when the power was out. As the Chief of Police, I am the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Coordinator. The OEM works in conjunction with our Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). LEPC is made up of representatives from Mayor Hornik's administration, the Police Department, fire, first aid, and public works. In addition, we are proud to work with Marlboro's Citizen Emergency Response Team (CERT). CERT are volunteers, age 18 and over, who receive free training and are called to assist in the case of an emergency. To learn more about becoming a member of CERT, contact Lt.
